With the Southern blockade, and other shortages of the War, my daughters and I are hard-pressed to dress for the social season. Shall we make cotton calico ball gowns (seemingly the only fabric available in our town!), or simply languish at home, lonely and uncelebrated this season?

Answer:

Dear Lady, take comfort that the demands of war need not impinge on your family's social pleasures overly much this season, though the exact nature of amusements may be altered. Of course, a cotton calico will not suffice for a gala in Washington, Boston, Richmond, Atlanta, or Philadelphia! Fortunately, most of us would not have occasion to attend such formal parties, war or no—and, as more and more of our social entertainments are not formal balls, but rather informal dances and hops, some held out of doors beneath a sheltering banner of canvas, some in rented social halls with an admission fee to be paid, we recommend a good everyday style of dress to the average woman, to be used for all "best" functions, including some dancing.

A woman's best dress, made with a high bodice and full-length sleeves, worn with crisp, tidy white collar and sleeve accessories, will be appropriate for community and social club dances. This might be in a pretty patterned cotton, a simple wool, or perhaps a silk made over from another dress.

This dress is not only suitable for community dancing parties, but for evening receptions of local political

## WCWA September 2004 Board of Directors Meeting Notes

11 September 2004, 10:00 A.M. ~  
Snohomish G. A. R. Cemetery Hall

**I.** Meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. by Chair Dan Rike.

**II.** Secretary Kevin Saville called roll and requested company reports. For the Administrative Board, all were present except Sharron Lawler. For the General Board, 19 voting representatives were present, consisting of 10 U.S. and 9 C.S. companies. This constituted a quorum. 3<sup>rd</sup> Michigan, proxy by Norm Harriman. 3<sup>rd</sup> U.S., Mark Aamot. 4<sup>th</sup> U.S., Rose Pugh. 7<sup>th</sup> Wisconsin, proxy by Kevin Saville. 20<sup>th</sup> Maine, proxy by Howard Struve. 76<sup>th</sup> Pennsylvania, Norm Harriman. 125<sup>th</sup> Ohio, Kevin Saville. U.S. Medical, Pat Pietsch. U.S.S. Tahoma and Marines, Lyle Gleason. 1<sup>st</sup> C.S. Engineers, proxy by Roy Houston. 1<sup>st</sup> Louisiana Zouaves, proxy by Bruce Wickler. 7<sup>th</sup> Tennessee, proxy by Bruce Wickler. 14<sup>th</sup> Virginia Cavalry, Burke Nebeker. 15<sup>th</sup> Alabama, David Imburgia. 26<sup>th</sup> North Carolina, Paul Juracek. 43<sup>rd</sup> Virginia/Mosby's, Steve Boudreau. Marines, Roy Houston. Stanford's Battery, Tom Peloquin. Not represented: 28<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts, Fife and Drum Corps, 4<sup>th</sup> Alabama, 7<sup>th</sup> South Carolina, Cobb's Battery, C.S. Medical, Polk's Battery, VMI.

For Commander's Reports, **Bruce Wickler** reported not a whole lot is going on right now. Bruce and Linda are making puppets for a puppet show in the civilian area and are creating some scenarios for the civilians. They are looking for civilian volunteers for the puppet shows and possibly some military participants as well. They will be

the traveling theater of Liberty Players who are always in rehearsal. **John Persinger** reported he's been beating the bushes for support for the 2004 tactical. John said 22 people are coming out of Oregon for the tactical; he hopes Washington outnumbers the Oregon support. Federal brigade paintball, followed by a picnic, is also on the agenda for October 16. **Linda Mount** said they had a good time at the Evergreen State Fair.

**III.** Kevin Saville presented minutes from the August meeting. **Minutes were unanimously approved as presented.**

**IV.** Zada Wheatley reported that the WCWA has 30 members so far for 2005. The WCWA had 760 members in 2004. As of 8/31/04, the stipend account held \$4,587 and the regular WCWA account held \$14,958. August expenses totaled \$7,067. Deposits totaled \$7,673 including \$4,392 from Rainier, \$1,521 from Orting, \$760 from new memberships, and a \$1,000 grant for Rainier. **The Treasurer's report was unanimously approved as presented.** Zada reminded everyone that The Dispatch is mailed based on applicant selection on the membership form. This selection is indicated on the membership roster.

### V. Old Business.

**A. Grant and Fundraising.** Cindy Easterson said if you are an event coordinator for an event anywhere near a Walmart or Sam's Club, the WCWA can seek and most likely receive a \$500 grant. Applications need to be submitted in December; please contact Cindy. Cindy said we made \$244 from the Louisiana Lottery that will be applied to the purchase of the Living History tent. She will be using photos of this year's tent to find sponsors for next year's tent. She is looking for material that will hold and maintain historic garments.

**B. Committee Structuring.** No report.

**C. Election Committee.** Kevin Saville said Paul Timmerman sent the ballots out the 6<sup>th</sup> of September, per the postmark; they are due back by Sep-

tember 25. None of the positions is contested: candidates are Dan Rike for Chair, Gil Bridges for Vice Chair, Kevin Saville for Secretary; Cindy Easterson for Treasurer, Rusty Starr for Confederate Battalion Commander, Linda Mount for Confederate Civilian Community Leader, John Persinger for Federal Brigade Commander, and no one for Federal Civilian Community Leader. It was pointed out that a Federal civilian community leader can be appointed.

### VI. New Business.

**A. 2005 Event Planning.** Dan Rike said he encourages event coordinators to submit future event contracts along with their event proposals and date requests. He said contracts may come in that may conflict with what we have agreed to do as a club. We don't have all the facts for an event when we approve a date, and possibly a budget, without a contract. Dan said we can move forward to review the schedule for next year and make a motion to accept or revise the sponsored event schedule. Dan noted that other events can be added to the calendar throughout the year. Sponsored events on the list to be approved included the Living History Conference in February, Spokane reenactment in May, Port Gamble in June, Deschutes/Rainier in July, and Hovander Farms/Ferndale in August. Discussion followed about moving some event dates; there was concern about the tactical fire danger in September, the Ferndale event in August due to the Northwest Washington fair being held then in Lynden, and having Deschutes/Rainier on a weekend when the NCWC may decide to announce an event in Oregon. Dan said our goal is to approve or not approve this agenda, or we could table this to the next meeting. **Rose Pugh moved that we accept the proposed calendar of events, as written. Motion was seconded by David Imburgia and passed with 18 yes, 0 no.** Dan thanked everyone for their input and said if we open dates up for bid in the future, we won't be so easily "wagged" by the events that go on around us. Dan said we do amazing events and we need to strive to be the premier events in the area.

### VII. FOR THE GOOD OF THE ORDER.

### A. Past Event Reports (All)

**Evergreen State Fair.** Pat Pietsch said there was a real good turnout of reenactors and public interested in us. She had a TV with recordings of our activities going in the barn all through the fair and gave out over 500 brochures on the WCWA. Pat said Darlene Landon was the star performer in the barn; everyone loved her. Pat would like to have the fife and drum corps and a cavalryman in the future.

### B. Upcoming Event Reports (All)

**Brigade Christmas Ball.** David said this is being planned for December 4 and will be a WCWA event. The Majestic Ballroom in Bellingham is a refurbished hall; tables and chairs are provided and it can handle a good-sized crowd. Parking is on the street only. David said the event will be open to all of the WCWA membership and families. David said it will be a potluck buffet. Input was sought on the pricing structure; it was decided to set the price now at \$15 per individual and \$35 per family. **Bruce Wickler moved that we make this a WCWA sponsored event that will be the Brigade Christmas Ball, December 4, 2004, in the Majestic Ballroom in Bellingham.** Expenditures are targeted to be \$1,475; Admission will be \$15 per person, \$35 per family. **Motion was seconded and passed with 17 yes, 0 no.**

### C. Announcements (All)

**Tall Ships Visit.** Tom Peloquin said the Tacoma Events Commission is requesting WCWA participation when the tall ships visit the Tacoma waterfront June 30-July 5, 2005. There was a good show of support from the board for the event.

**G.A.R. Cemetery Work Party.** Bruce said a work party will occur after the meeting.

**Port Gamble 2005.** Howard Struve said the North Kitsap Herald has an article in place for the Port Gamble event.

**Volunteer Hours.** Corky Savoie said any hours spent educating the public on

what we do should be submitted to her. This includes time that we're in front of people, talking and reenacting. Cleaning facilities like the G.A.R. cemetery also counts. Send hours to corkym3@juno.com. The form will again be in an upcoming Dispatch.

**Insurance Riders.** David Imburgia said when we look at the 2005 schedule, we also need to budget for insurance. David explained that sometimes there is requested an additional rider for "additional insured" when the host wants to be named on the WCWA insurance policy. There were six "additional insured" riders requested and used in 2004. Beyond the six that were on the 2004 policy, each additional rider would have cost the WCWA \$150 to 250. We need to inquire for each of our events if we will be required to provide an "additional insured" rider. Event coordinators, please let David know.

**Hovander School Event.** David said we forgot to ask for sanctioning of the Hovander school event May 19-20. The 15<sup>th</sup> Alabama has reimbursed the WCWA for the additional insurance cost for the school event. Dan said anything that requires insurance coverage should be approved by the board for inclusion on the schedule. **Bruce moved that we add the May 19-20 Hovander school event to the calendar for 2005. Motion was seconded and passed with 19 yes and 0 no.**

**VMI.** Paul Juracek submitted a proposal in regard to the current organization and purpose of the VMI. Requests have been made from both the proposal drafters and the VMI commander via email to encourage the WCWA membership at large to further cultivate and involve the VMI youth in as many activities and areas for education as possible.

**Adjourn.** Meeting was adjourned at 11:49 a.m.12:01 p.m.

## Sally Lunn Bread

*Taken from "Revolutionary Recipes" by Patricia B. Mitchell*

*In the South a bread called Sally Lunn might be served at dinner. Folklore tells us that Sally Lunn was a pastry cook in the fashionable English resort of Bath. She peddled her tea cakes from a basket on the street until a baker named Dalmer bought her out and began delivering hot "Sally Lunn's" from portable ovens carried about in wheelbarrows. Dalmer even wrote a song about Sally. The words are forgotten, but not the bread.*

### Ingredients:

1 package active dry yeast  
1/4 cup warm water  
1/2 cup hot milk  
2/3 cup butter, softened  
3/4 teaspoon salt  
2 cups all-purpose flour  
2 eggs, well-beaten

Dissolve the yeast in warm water. In a separate bowl, pour hot milk over butter, sugar, and salt. When the butter has melted, stir in 1/2 cup flour. Beat until smooth. Add the yeast mixture; mix well. Add half of the remaining flour and beat until no lumps remain. Add eggs; beat hard. Add remaining flour and beat vigorously at least 5 minutes. Scrape down batter from the sides of the bowl. Cover the bowl and allow to rise in a warm place until doubled in size—about 45 minutes.

When doubled, beat again at least 5 minutes and then spoon into a greased 1 1/2 quart ring mold or Turk's head mold. Cover and let rise again until doubled.

Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 30-35 minutes, or until golden brown. Yield: one ring loaf.
